




Summary of Measure A Funding and Total Program Costs FY23/24 Budget

- #5 worst ozone pollution in U.S.



Sources of smog-forming emissions in the region


- Largest source is <u>transportation</u> <u>sector</u> (cars, trucks, equipment, buses, etc.)





- ☐ Investing ~\$20 million annually






